

NORTHEAST BELLEVUE NEIGHBORHOOD AREA PROFILE

The Northeast Bellevue Neighborhood Area stretches from the shores of Lake Sammamish to the Microsoft campus in Redmond. Many neighborhoods in the area were built between the 1960s and 1980s, and several include private recreational facilities and parks. The area encompasses the neighborhoods of Lakewood Park, Sherwood Forest, Ardmore, Crofton, Tam O’Shanter, Bretton Wood, Rosemont Beach, Belmore and Valley Green. Approximately 33 percent of residents, ages five and older, speak a language other than English at home, including Chinese (6%), Spanish (5%), Vietnamese (3%), Russian (2%) and Tagalog (1%). Of the 11,024 people living in NE Bellevue, about 67 percent identify as White, 22 percent as Asian, five percent as Hispanic and three percent as Black or African American. About 30 percent of NE Bellevue residents were born in a foreign country, of which 65 percent were born in Asia, 23 percent were born in Europe, and 8 percent were born in Latin America. The most common household type in the area is married couples without children, at 41 percent, followed by married couples with children at 27 percent, and singles at 15 percent. The largest age group in the area is 18 to 44 year-olds (30%), followed by 45 to 64 year-olds (29%), and those under 18 (21%). Educational attainment in the area is high, with nearly 60 percent of residents 25 years old and older holding a bachelor’s degree or higher. Approximately 95 percent of the area’s 3,917 households are occupied.
